### ***Images of Social Justice***

From the Segura Arts Studios of Social Justice from the Segura Arts Studio master printer and publisher Joe Segura has dedicated his life's work to collaborative printmaking, working with and promoting artists from underrepresented cultural groups. This exhibition features 36 prints created at Segura Arts Studio by 17 visiting artists. Social justice issues bind these artists together, each tackling either human, animal, or land rights issues in their own style to express concerns regarding the abuse of power, culture wars, race, gender, and citizenship.

### ***Christian Benefiel: Sculpture***

Maryland-based artist Christian Benefiel focuses on sculpture and installation using found and discarded materials. Using physics to construct his large-scale sculptures, Benefiel connects science and art in a highly visible way: his work relies on the concepts of fulcrum, counterweight, and tension. As a professor at Shepherd University in Shepherdstown, WV, he brings an educator's perspective to art display and creation.
