Transfer basics

Priority Application Deadline	December 1*	February 1*
Admission Decision Notification	Within two weeks of submitting a completed application	Within two weeks of submitting a completed application
FAFSA Priority Deadline	November 15	February 15
Financial Aid Notification	by December 15	by March 1
Admission Decision Deadline	January 5	May 1

* Beyond these dates, applications are considered on a space-available basis until two weeks before the start of classes.

- For admission, applicants should have an overall GPA of 2.5 on all college-level work
- The bachelor's degree is granted only after completing at least two years at Hollins, including your senior year
- Housing policy: You are required to live in on-campus housing unless you are at least 23 years of age or live with a parent or guardian in the Roanoke area



How to apply—no fee

FOR TRADITIONAL-AGE APPLICANTS

- Apply on the Hollins website at admissions.hollins.edu/apply/.
- GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale on all college-level work is recommended.
- A campus visit is strongly encouraged.

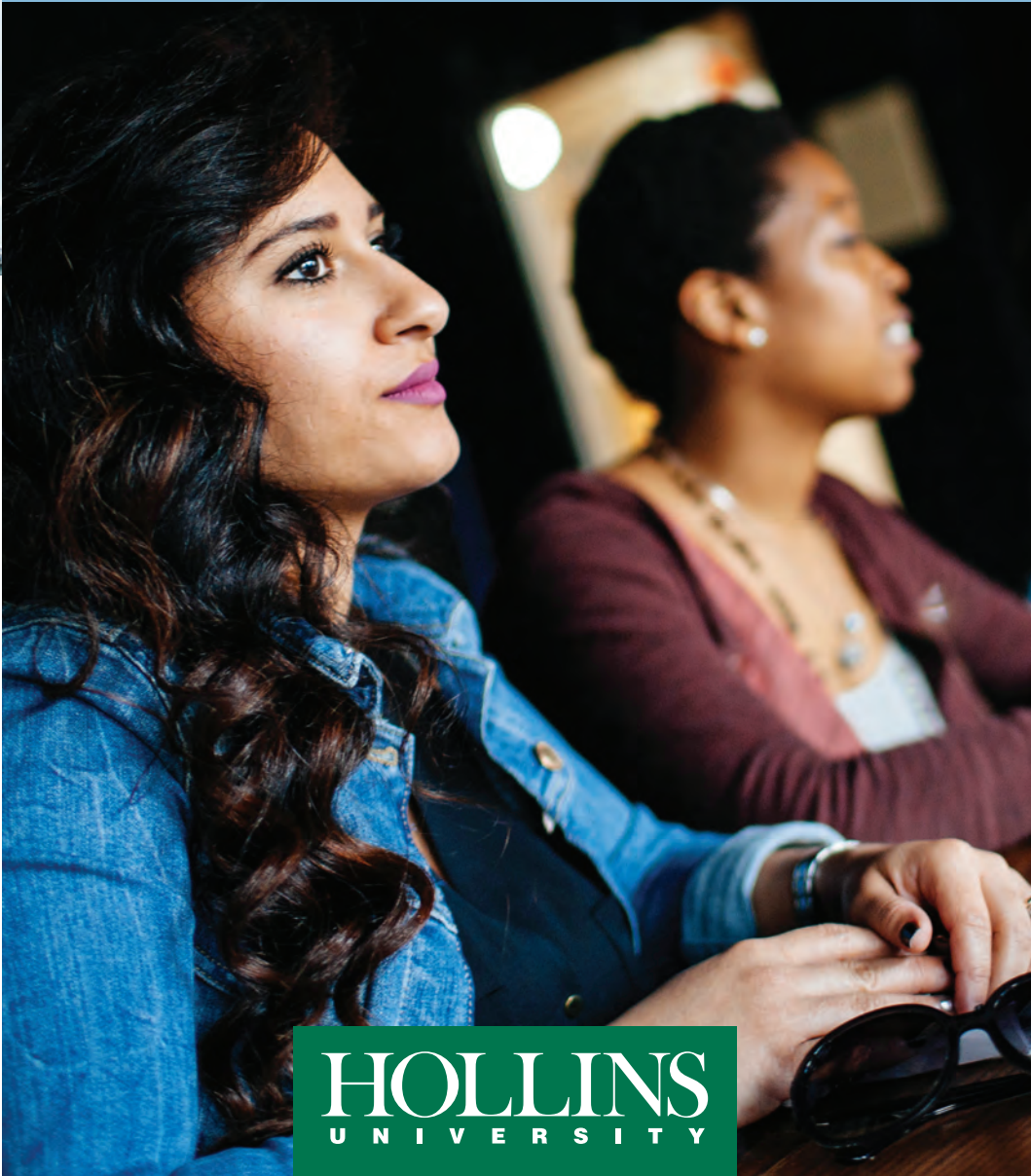

How will my credits transfer?

- Credit is awarded for courses taken at a regionally accredited college or university that are **deemed comparable to Hollins, with a grade of C (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) or better.**
- To determine if your course will transfer to Hollins, **please submit an official transcript(s) for evaluation.** The university registrar will evaluate your transcript(s) and complete a Transfer Credit Evaluation (TCE) form, which the transfer coordinator will send to you, and help answer your questions.
- Review your TCE carefully. **Sometimes the registrar will need additional information to evaluate your transcript(s),** such as a course description or syllabus for a particular course.
- **To determine if a transferable course will fulfill a Hollins major requirement, please contact our transfer coordinator.** She will work with Hollins faculty to determine if any transferable courses fulfill major requirements.



Hollins is affordable

All students are encouraged to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov to determine need-based aid and additional funding.

MERIT TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

Hollins offers merit-based scholarships that are reserved just for transfer students.

2.75-2.99 GPA: **half-tuition scholarship**

3.0-3.49 GPA: **\$21,000 scholarship**

3.5+ GPA: **\$24,000 scholarship**

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Awards are **\$2,000** per year through graduation. Must submit proof of membership.
