	<i>Humanistic Geography: Uncovering a Sense of Place</i> Gina Louthian-Stanley '00 is a multimedia artist, writer, and workshop instructor born and living in the Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia. Louthian-Stanley has worked primarily as a

In 2006, she began experimenting with encaustic techniques in which she juxtaposes transparent and opaque layers coupled with unique textures. Louthian-Stanley's works represent physical and emotional sensations which carry the viewer into a narrative inspired by the natural world. She writes, "I pursued my childhood dream of becoming an artist, continuing as a student to earn my B.A. in studio art from Hollins and my master's from Radford University. While I love learning, I also want to help others reach their goals to find their creative voice."

CUBA: Beyond Mambo and Rock 'n Roll

This attitude and quest for freedom for themselves and their country is apparent in each of the artists' work whether they examine human rights, fantastical inventions, or philosophical concerns. *CUBA: Beyond Mambo and Rock 'n Roll* provides an opportunity to learn about Cuba through the eyes of artists whose work speaks to their nation's history,
